

# CoJourners

## A passionate and purposeful adventure in authentic relationships

Every person is on a spiritual journey. Some are moving toward God, while others are moving away. Some are choosing other so-called gods and many have become stuck in a spiritual quagmire. Everyone is on a spiritual journey, for we have been created as spiritual beings.

There is no greater privilege than to enter into a person's journey and help them come to Jesus. That is the role of the CoJourneyer. A CoJourneyer is a person who travels with others spiritually, helping them come to Jesus.

There are four primary roles a CoJourneyer plays in another person's spiritual journey:

**Explorer** - to discover where they are spiritually

**Guide** - to show them the way to Jesus

**Builder** - to provide bridges over the obstacles along the way

**Mentor** - to encourage them to continue on

A healthy group meeting balances personal sharing, Bible study and prayer. However, an often neglected yet equally important dimension of the group is service or ministry. The CoJourners Equipment Pack fosters the ministry component by providing practical discussions and action steps as supplements (not replacements) to other group priorities.

The CoJourneyer's Equipment Pack includes twenty cards discussing motivation and the four CoJourneyer roles. Each 8-12 minute discussion focuses on one idea or experience. Together they equip and engage the group members in effective witness, particularly among their friends and acquaintances. The cards can be used flexibly, in any order, according to the needs or interest of the group.

Here's how to incorporate the CoJourneyer cards into your group meeting.

- 1) Pick a card that addresses a need of your group.

- 3) The cards come in sets of four. Make sure to isolate the card you want to use for the week and include the front and back sides when you make the copies.
- 4) Hand out the selected card during your meeting to everyone there. Read through it, it's that easy.
- 5) The next week pick a different card that will help the group reach out more effectively.
